ENVIRONMENTAL AND SOCIAL COMMITMENT PLAN (ESCP)

- The Government of Bangladesh (GoB) will implement the Private Investment and Digital Entrepreneur Project (PRIDE) (the Project), with the involvement of the Bangladesh Economic Zones Authority (BEZA) (*Component 1-3*) and Bangladesh Hi-Tech Park Authority (BHTPA) (*Component 4*). The International Development Association (hereinafter the Bank) has agreed to provide financing for the Project.
- 2. **The GoB** will implement material measures and actions so that the Project (*Component 1-3*) is implemented in accordance with the Environmental and Social Standards (**ESSs**). This Environmental and Social Commitment Plan (**ESCP**) sets out material measures and actions, any specific documents or plans, as well as the timing for each of these.
- 3. **The GoB** will also comply with the provisions of any other E&S documents required under the ESF and referred to in this ESCP, such as Environmental and Social Management Plans (**ESMP**), Environmental and Social Management Framework (**ESMF**), Labor Management procedures (**LMP**), Stakeholder Engagement Plans (**SEP**) etc and the timelines specified in those E&S documents.
- 4. **The GoB** is responsible for compliance with all requirements of the ESCP even when implementation of specific measures and actions is conducted by the Implementing Agency (IA) (BEZA) referenced in 1 above.
- 5. Implementation of the material measures and actions set out in this ESCP will be monitored and reported to the **Bank** by **GoB** as required by the ESCP and the conditions of the legal agreement, and the **Bank** will monitor and assess progress and completion of the material measures and actions throughout implementation of the Project.
- 6. As agreed by the **Bank** and the **GoB**, this ESCP may be revised from time to time during Project implementation, to reflect adaptive management of Project changes and unforeseen circumstances or in response to assessment of Project performance conducted under the ESCP itself. In such circumstances, the **GoB** will agree to the changes with the **Bank** and will update the ESCP to reflect such changes. Agreement on changes to the ESCP will be documented through the exchange of letters signed between the **Bank** and the **GoB**. The **GoB** will promptly disclose the updated ESCP.
- 7. Where Project changes, unforeseen circumstances, or Project performance result in changes to the risks and impacts during Project implementation, the **GoB** shall provide additional funds, if needed, to implement actions and measures to address such risks and impacts, which may include environmental, health, social, safety impacts, labor influx, gender-based violence etc.
